PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to 2023.



We had quite the year last year. I am so proud of all of you for standing up to a government that thought they could walk all over us. 55,000 members across the province showed the PC government that we were not backing down. The walkouts were a huge success and forced the government to repeal Bill 28 where the government used the *notwithstanding clause* to try to take away our bargaining rights. We did not make all the gains we were hoping for, but we have 4 years to show the government how much our services are needed. One way to do this is to work to your collective agreement. Take your breaks, lunches and only work the hours your are scheduled, unless you are approved ahead of time for overtime or time in lieu. Working for free shows the government and employer that we do not need additional hours to truly do our jobs. This includes facilities doing a split shift. Even if you stay at the school, you are not paid for that time. If there is an emergency, ensure your supervisor is in agreement with you claiming overtime or lieu time before completing the task.

Another success of 2022 was the Supreme Court ruling that Bill 124 was a violation of the collective bargaining act. The courts found there was no reason to cap wages in this bill at 1% except to deny the right to bargain wages. Of course the PC government plans to appeal the decision, but this could turn into a huge win for public sector workers.

As we head into 2023, your bargaining team is working with the UCDSB to bargain a Local agreement. We have 2 bargaining dates, January 11th and 12th, and will be getting into the articles with which we hope to make the most gains. Please remember, we cannot bargain anything monetary in the Local collective agreement. Watch your CUPE emails for updates. Please continue to wear purple on Wednesdays to show solidarity.

We have also begun STEO bargaining and will continue in this new year. We have agreed to review what has been tabled and will continue to meet.

As we move into this New Year, remember to take care of yourselves and your families. Take time to reflect on all our accomplishments.

NATIONAL SECTOR COUNCIL CONFERENCE

Shaw Center, Ottawa Mon., Oct 3rd, to Thurs., Oct. 6th, 2022

This bilingual conference was a mask mandatory event. Registration opened at 3:00 p.m. with the open plenary Monday night (6:30 to 8:00 p.m) with co-moderators Richard Delisle, National Regional Vice-President, Quebec and Yolanda McClean, National Regional Vice-President, Ontario. The theme of the evening was National Diversity with Indigenous teachings including the Blanket Ceremony. "By-Stander" training was covered followed by a welcome from National CUPE President, Mark Hancock . A reception was enjoyed in the Trillium Ballroom on the 4th floor of the Shaw Center.

Each morning (with the exception of Thursday) delegates gathered in the Open Plenary Room (9:00 to 10:45) on the 3rd floor where keynote speakers and panelist covered a variety of topics: "Safe Union Spaces Working Group – Safe Spaces, Stronger Unions". Their ongoing work shows the success in tackling austerity and privatization and depends on the ability of all union members to thrive inside our movement, free of gender-based violence harassment discrimination, and other forms of oppression. "Fighting inflation without weakening workers". "CUPE Members resist the threat of privatization".

The Education Sector breakout rooms were on the 2nd floor. Where education workers from every province spoke about their good news stories and challenges. These Sector Meetings took place every day from 10:45 to 12:00 and 1:30 to 4:30. Presentations were made on "Inflation and wages in K-12 Sector; "Bargaining and Mobilization success stories" – where Laura Walton spoke on behalf of Ontario. "Violence in Schools". Group Discussions on priority concerns by occupational groups – very interesting discussing other provinces concern and problems. "Making Changes in the K-12 Sector".

The convention "Bag" included booklets on "Truth and Reconciliation: CUPE taking action through collective bargaining." "Bargaining Beyond the Binary - a negotiating guide for Trans Inclusion and Gender Diversity." "CUPE Anti-Racism Strategy 2021-2027." "Asking the right questions: a guide for municipalities considering P3s." "And the Fall 2020 Counterpoint magazine where the Profile of the month was Laura Walton and Ontario's fight.

Are you close to retirement age or going to retire within the next 120 calendar days? Can you retire with an unreduced pension? If you do not know these answers, please go to the OMERS website-https://www.omers.com/ or call OMERS-1-800-283-5375 and find out as soon as possible.

Here is why:

- 1. If you are 65 years of age within the next 120 calendar days, or
- 2. If you are going to retire with a reduced pension within the next 120 calendar days, or
- 3. If you are going to retire with an unreduced pension within the next 120 calendar days, or
- 4. If you qualify for an unreduced pension within the next 120 calendar days.

You are NO longer eligible for Long Term Disability and you need to notify the board to STOP taking LTD premiums from you!

To find out how to stop these payments please refer to the collective agreement article 25.01 b), as you will have to provide proof from OMERS and send it to the employer.
