#### STEO NEWS

Did you know STEO starts working on the next school year as early as January.

Both school boards (UCDSB and CDSBEO) provide school boundary and program changes for the upcoming year, so STEO can get the School Eligibility Tool ready for new school year registrations.



Student Incident reporting for student aggression can also be reported on School Buses and Vans.

In STEO's **Transportation Information and Guidelines for Students and Parents** found on the STEO website under Virtual Backpack. <a href="https://www.steo.ca/virtual-backpack/">https://www.steo.ca/virtual-backpack/</a>

"School buses under contract with STEO are considered to be an extension of the school system. Consequently, the disciplinary standards set by your school, school board, and STEO will apply to all vehicle passengers. Students whose behaviour endangers the safety or interferes with the comfort of others may have their riding privileges revoked."

It also states "Students are accountable to the school principal for their behaviour on the school bus. The bus driver acts on behalf of the principal. This applies to school buses and vans. The driver will report the student/incident to the principal in writing.".

The principal will follow the same procedure for incidents on a school bus as incidents during school.

It's December and snow is on its way and some of our Facilities Staff will be asked to do snow load check on blistery cold days. Please remember if you feel going on any building roof to measure the snow or just doing a roof check is unsafe you need to email and contact your supervisor and let them know that it is unsafe! Remember you have the right to refuse unsafe work.

If you missed the Health and Safety part of your school's Staff meeting, please reach out to your Administrator, and have the conversation about Yak Tracks. Remember to put them on every time you go outside when the grounds are icy. Everyone needs a pair if you do Bus Duty or Yard Duty. Keep your Yak Tracks with your outdoor wear.



If you do not have a pair now, email your Administrator and they will send an Email off to Dennis Koluk to receive your free Yak Tracks. This comes out of the **health and safety budget not the schools**.

Thank you to those that are filling out the **On-Line Incident Reports**, if you would like someone to come to your site for a visit please reach out! We are here to help you and make your day transition smoothly.

In your agenda on page 28 and 29 there is a user-friendly page on when to complete the Online Reporting form or KICs in some case you may have to fill out both forms. If you feel you need to fill out either of these forms, it is your right, and you do not need your Administrators' permission to complete them. If you are required to complete your Parklane at the end of your shift please ask your Administrator if you go over your scheduled departure time you can put in for overtime. These online reports are not to be completed on your own time or during your lunch break, they are to be completed during your scheduled work time.

# NATIONAL SECTOR COUNCIL CONFERENCE

October 7-10, 2024, Winnipeg

Delegates Erin Hurford, Sheila Robertson, Darrin Cryderman and myself ventured to Winnipeg to the conference where nearly 1,000 delegates from across Canada gathered at the RBC Convention Centre in downtown Winnipeg to learn how to advocate for workers' rights in the workplace through effective political action. Sectors represented were childcare, communications, education, emergency & security services, energy, health care, library, municipal, post-secondary, social services and transportation. This allowed us to advocate for our members (education) by engaging in meaningful discussions to strengthen our collective power.

Panel discussions on health & safety and co-ordinated bargaining took place in the plenary room. Followed by break-out rooms for sector-specific training and

educational sessions, where further collaboration, training and discussions on how to strengthen efforts, bargaining and political action ensuring we are prepared to fight for workers' rights. Education workers broke into classification-specific

groups to dig deeper into the



challenges and realities faced in schools across Canada. These conversations dove into the concerns we all share as overcrowded classrooms, violence in the workplace and underfunded resources.

The Winnipeg General Strike Bus Tour took place Tuesday evening. The six week Winnipeg General Strike of 1919 remains the longest open-ended general strike in Canadian labour history. The bus tour detailed the history of this strike through an exploration of various neighborhoods in the city.

Wednesday evening was Drag Trivia Night - where you got to see how much you really knew about history, music, movies etc. A very entertaining evening.



We had the opportunity to listen to a number of guest speakers, one that resonated with me was the newly elected Premier of Manitoba, NDP Wab Kinew, Canada's first provincial premier of First Nations decent and Manitoba's first Indigenous premier since Metis Premier John Noquay in 1887. Personally, Wab Kinew brought back visions of the late Jack Layton with his similar core values. He reminded the crowd that politics matters – unions have the power to change politics.

The conference enabled us to strategize with workers from across the country in meetings tailored to specific sector's needs and challenges. Learned how to advocate for workers' rights and public services through effective political action. As economic and political challenges mount, CUPE locals in all sectors are faced with increasingly difficult bargaining. For us to keep achieving real gains for our members, we must be ready to bargain smart. By sharing information related to job sectors and occupations, members were able to learn from one another, identify best practices and winning strategies, as well as strengthened the sectors by way of increased knowledge and ideas amongst our local activists.
